Dear Mr. Merrion:

On January 18, 2002, New Mexico Oil Conservation Division (OCD) Deputy Inspector, Bruce Martin, found that the referenced wells had not been tested as reported.

An OCD investigation found that on January 9, 2002, Merrion Oil & Gas (Merrion) submitted "Bradenhead Test Report" forms containing intentionally false information on the referenced wells.

Merrion and the OCD conducted a joint field trip to several well sites on January 31, 2002. On February 1, 2002, Merrion presented the OCD with a proposed comprehensive well testing and reporting program for well testing to prevent future violations and to retest all wells for which questionable information may have been submitted.

Because of Merrion's quick response and comprehensive plan, this office will not take further enforcement action.

Any further violation may result in Merrion being summoned to a show cause hearing before a Division Hearing Examiner where the Division staff will recommend issuance of a formal order requiring compliance with OCD rules. Such an order may include imposition of civil penalties.
