Reference is made to your letter of March 25, 1963 regarding deviation on the Foutz and Burson #1 Val well located in Unit I, Section 27-28N-1W, Rio Arriba County.

It is understood that Foutz and Bursum owns the 40-acre tracts toe North and East of the tract upon which this well is located. It is also understood that all ownership interests in all three 40-acre tracts is common. It is, therefore, evident that it would be impossible for the bottom of the hole to be located on acreage other than that owned by Foutz and Bursum.

We therefore grant you request for an exception to the directional survey requirements.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

ADOPTED SEPTEMBER 17, 1787

Article I

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2.

Clause 1. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Clause 2. No Person shall be a Representative who shall not have attained to the Age of twenty five Years, seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and when elected shall have been seven Years a Citizen of the State in which he shall be chosen.

Section 3.

Clause 1. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for the Term of six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Clause 2. No Person shall be a Senator who shall not have attained to the Age of thirty Years, seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and when elected shall have been seven Years a Citizen of the State in which he shall be chosen.

Section 4. The Senators and Representatives shall receive Compensation for their Services, which shall be ascertained by Law.
