Your Application for Permit to Drill the No. 2 Jicarilla 28-3 well in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. 5, T.28N., R.3W., Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, on Jicarilla lease contract No. 82 was approved by this office on January 22, 1976. By letter of February 16, 1977, you notified the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission that the subject well would not be drilled.
