

THE APPLICATION OF EL PASO NATURAL GAS COMPANY FOR PERMISSION TO EFFECT DUAL COMPLETION OF ITS HUERFANO UNIT WELL NO. 106 LOCATED IN THE NW/4 SE/4 OF SECTION 33, TOWNSHIP 27 NORTH, RANGE 10 WEST, NMPM, SAN JUAN COUNTY, NEW MEXICO, IN SUCH A MANNER AS TO PERMIT THE PRODUCTION OF GAS FROM THE ANGELS PEAK-GALLUP POOL AND THE PRODUCTION OF GAS FROM THE ANGELS PEAK-DAKOTA POOL.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A (c) El Paso Natural Gas Company, made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on May 4, 1959, for permission to dually complete its Huerfano Unit Well No. 106, located in the NW/4 SE/4 of Section 33, Township 27 North, Range 10 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from the Angels Peak-Gallup Pool and the production of gas from the Angels Peak-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 14th day of September, 1959, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Sub-section 'c' of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, El Paso Natural Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Huerfano Unit Well No. 106 located in the NW/4 SE/4 of Section 33, Township 27 North, Range 10 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from the Angels Peak-Gallup Pool and the production of gas from the Angels Peak-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section V, Rule 112-A, as amended by Order R-1214.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Angels Peak-Dakota Pool.

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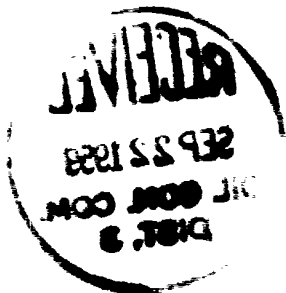
