

**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION**

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, El Paso Natural Gas Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on September 9, 1965, for permission to dually complete its Huerfanito Unit Well No. 88 located in Unit B of Section 23, Township 27 North, Range 9 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 29th day of September, 1965, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of the offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

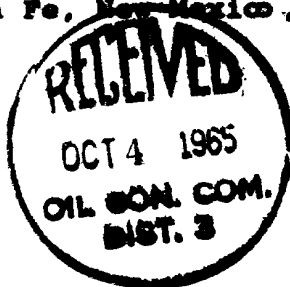
That the applicant herein, El Paso Natural Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Huerfanito Unit Well No. 88 located in Unit B of Section 23, Township 27 North, Range 9 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of 2-7/8 inch casing cemented in a common well bore.

**PROVIDED HOWEVER,** That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

**PROVIDED FURTHER,** That applicant shall take segregation tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:** That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

EXHIBITATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 113-A, El Paso Natural Gas Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on September 9, 1965, for permission to dual complete Unit Well No. 88 located in Unit B of Section 33, Township 33 North, Range 9 West, T12N, R9W, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Bland-Hessville Pool and the Bland-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 15th day of September, 1965, the Commission, Director:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 113-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operations of the offset straddles have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as provided by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste or injure productive strata.
- (5) That the mechanism of the proposed dual completion is feasible and consistent with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, El Paso Natural Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dual complete its Unit Well No. 88 located in Unit B of Section 33, Township 33 North, Range 9 West, T12N, R9W, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Bland-Hessville Pool and the Bland-Dakota Pool through parallel straddles of 2-1/8 inch casing cemented in a common well bore.

PRAYER & REQUEST. That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 113-A.

COMMISSION FINDINGS. That applicant shall take appropriate steps upon completion and annually thereafter during the initial delivery test period for the Bland-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That production of this case be hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

That it shall be the duty of the applicant, on the day and year hereinabove designated.
