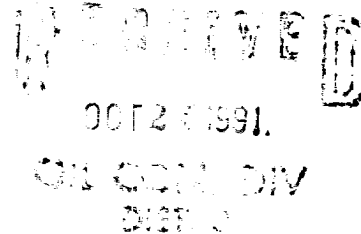

Administrative Order NSL-3068

Dear Bill:

Reference is made to your application dated October 1, 1991 for a non-standard Basin-Fruitland coal gas well location for your existing Lodewick Well No. 1 which was drilled in 1951 and completed in the Fulcher Kutz Pictured Cliffs Pool at a standard gas well location 990 feet from the South and East lines (Unit P) of Section 18, Township 27 North, Range 9 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico.

It is my understanding that the Pictured Cliffs zone will be properly plugged back and said well will be recompleted to the Basin-Fruitland Coal Gas Pool, which pursuant to the Special Rules and Regulations for the Basin-Fruitland Coal Gas Pool as promulgated by Division Order No. R-8768, as amended, is unorthodox. Further, Lots 3 and 4, the E/2 SW/4, and SE/4 (S/2 equivalent) of said Section 18 shall be dedicated to the well forming a standard 321.08-acre gas spacing and proration unit for said pool.

By authority granted me under the provisions of Rule 8 of the Division Order No. R-8768, as amended, the above described unorthodox coal gas well location is hereby approved.
