
Surface Commingling Applications Re:

I have reviewed the two (2) applications you filed on behalf of Breck Operating Company to surface commingle South Blanco-Pictured Cliffs Gas Pool production from the Marron "A" No. 1 & 1J and the Marshall "3" No. 1 & 1J. It appears to me that no surface commingling approval is required for these wells. Surface commingling is approved by this office in those instances where:

- a) two or more wells on the same lease are producing from different common sources of supply (pool commingling);
- b) two or more wells from separate leases are producing from a single common sources of supply (lease commingling); or
- c) two or more wells from separate leases are producing from different common sources of supply (pool-lease commingling.)

The data in your applications indicates that each of the respective pairs of wells are on the same lease, the interest ownership is common, and all the wells are producing from the South Blanco-Pictured Cliffs Gas Pool.

Please provide me with an additional explanation as to why surface commingling approval is necessary for these wells in order that we may determine the proper disposition of these applications.
