Gentlemen:

The above well has never been on the proration schedule for the reason that the previous application had not filed the proper forms when the District Office of the Oil Conservation Commission. El Paso Natural Gas Co. has now filed C-110 showing that they have purchased this well. This letter will serve as your authority to commence taking gas from this well. However, we will be unable to compute an allowable as no Initial Potential test was filed. It will, therefore, be necessary the El Paso Natural Gas o. estimate a deliverability in the following manner:

The well should be allowed to flow unrestrictedly into the pipeline for a minimum period of 14 days. Then the operator may use the next 7 or 8 days production chart to arrive at an estimated daily deliverability. This information, along with a photostat of the chart should be submitted to this office. When we have this information an allowable will be assigned retroactive to this date.

This well should also be re-scheduled for an annual deliverability test, under provisions of Order R-333-B, prior to November 1, 1955.
