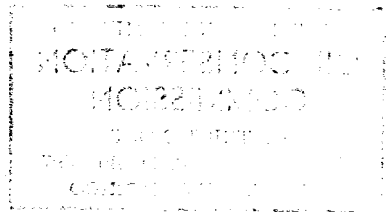
1. Drill surface hole and run and set approximately 100' 8-5/8" surface casing and cement to surface.
2. Test surface casing, cement plug and drill to base of Pictured Cliffs sandstone at approximately 2000'.
3. Run electric log to total depth.
4. Run and set approximately 1900' of 5 1/2" N-40 14# casing on top of Pictured Cliffs sandstone and cement with 150 sacks of cement.
5. Move off rotary tools, test production string cement plug, drill cement plug, clean out to bottom and shoot with nitro shot.
6. Clean out after shot and complete well ready for production.

I understand that this plan of work must be approved by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.

1. The Commission was organized by the President of the United States in May 1968, in response to the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The Commission's mandate was to identify the causes of violence and to recommend measures to prevent it. The Commission has held numerous public hearings and has received many suggestions from the public. It has also conducted extensive research into the social, economic, and cultural factors that contribute to violence.

2. The Commission has found that violence is a complex phenomenon that is influenced by many factors. These factors include poverty, unemployment, lack of education, racial discrimination, and the availability of firearms. The Commission has also found that violence is often a result of a combination of these factors.

3. The Commission has recommended a number of measures to prevent violence. These measures include improving the economy, providing education and training, eliminating racial discrimination, and controlling the sale of firearms. 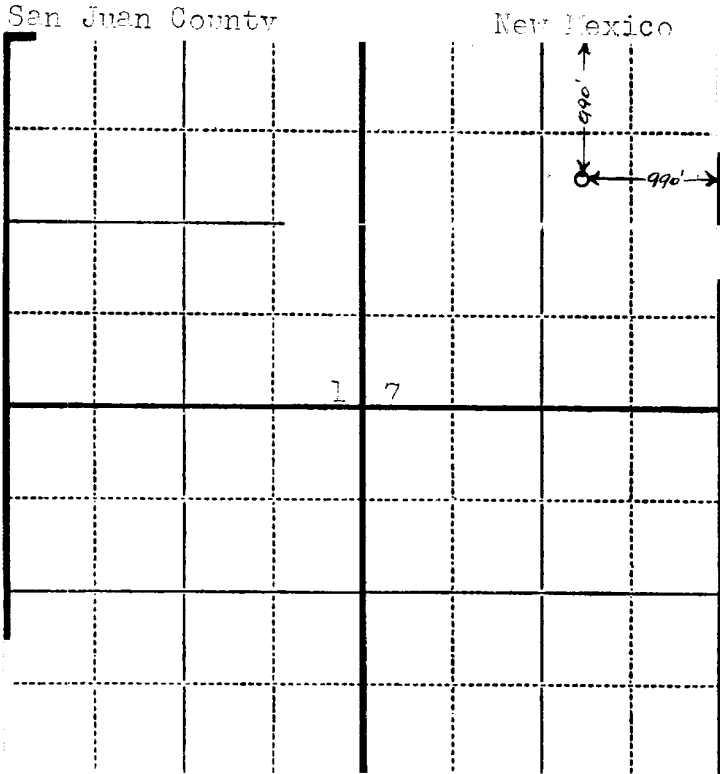
