client. Sites and isolates are defined according to CPRC Rule 87-8, Section 4f. Traditional cultural properties are defined in relation to those described by Van Valkenburgh (1974) and Parker & King (1991).

RECORDS SEARCH

A records search was conducted prior to field inspection at the B.L.M., Farmington District office on February 3, 2000, to determine if any sites had been recorded within a one mile radius of the project area. An ARMS search by modern was conducted on that same day. Projects in this area for which previous cultural resource inspections have been conducted include powerline projects and oil & gas related development projects. The records search showed thirty previously recorded sites within one mile of the project (See Government Supplement Map). Two sites are within 500 feet. Site (LA 69659) is a Navajo sweat lodge plotted 100 feet from the project. The other site (LA 68611/NM-01-34961) is a Navajo Dinetah artifact scatter which is 400 feet from the project area. Both sites are considered to be eligible for nomination to the National Register of Historic Places. Neither property will be affected by this undertaking.

Ethnographic Search:

A review of Van Valkenburgh (1974) showed the nearest known Navajo traditional cultural property (TCP), Mesa Cuartado (Harris Mesa), is approximately 1 mile from the project and will not be affected by this undertaking. Review of the Huerfano and the Fresno Canyon topographic map indicates there are no Euro-american or Hispanic TCP's within at least three miles of the project.
