We are returning copies of Notice of Intention to Drill, for Midwest Oil Company #1 Navajo well located in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 31-28N-14W. This well is located on Indian Land and the Application for Permit to Drill is therefore filed with the USGS Office in Farmington on Federal Form 9-331-c. We have an agreement with the USGS whereby they forward us copies of applications for permit to drill and all subsequent reports on wells drilled on Federal Lands in this area. We have received our two copies of the Federal Form for this well this morning.

If production is secured on the well you will file New Mexico Oil Commission Form C-104 in order to secure an allowable and authorizing a transporter. Monthly production reports must also be filed on Commission Form C-115. I am enclosing a small supply of each of these forms for your future use.
