Ran 163' of 10-3/4" OD, 32.75#, H-40 Smls. Casing, landed at 1730' cemented with 175 sacks Regular Neat Cement. Plug pumped to 135', cement circulated to surface.

Ran drill pipe to top of plug, closed B.O. Preventer, pressured up with 500#, held pressure for 30 minutes, no loss of pressure, no leaks.
