Calow Well No. 12 located in the NE/4 NW/4 of Section 33, Township 29 North, Range 13 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of oil from the Totah-Gallup Oil Pool and the production of gas from an undesignated Dakota Pool.

NOW, on this 10th day of March, 1960, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Sub-section 'c' of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Tennessee Gas Transmission Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its USA Glenn H. Calow Well No. 12 located in the NE/4 NW/4 of Section 33, Township 29 North, Range 13 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of oil from the Totah-Gallup Oil Pool and the production of gas from an undesignated Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section V, Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability
