DETAILS OF WORK

The above well was spudded on September 20, 1957, and on September 21, 1957, 13-3/8" casing was set at 251 feet with 125 sacks of 8% gel and followed by 125 sacks of cement. After waiting on cement for 24 hours, casing and water shut off were tested with 900 pounds pressure for 30 minutes, which held with no drop in pressure.
