Dear Mr. Verrity:

Reference is made to your letter of November 7, 1960 regarding your plans for drilling a well located 1450 feet from the North line and 1190 feet from the East line of Section 22, Township 29 North, Range 12 West, San Juan County.

This letter will constitute approval for the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission of the above location. As your unit consists at the present time of 160 acres, being the Northeast Quarter of Section 22, and Order R-1287-A specifies 320-acre drilling blocks for wells completed in the Dakota producing interval, this is a non-standard unit. Production from any well completed in the Dakota formation could not be approved until 320 acres in Section 22 has been communitized or until a non-standard unit has been approved after hearing.

Dear Mr. Foster:

Reference is made to your letter of October 17, 1900, regarding your
plans for drilling a well located 14 1/2 feet from the north line and
1150 feet from the west line of Section 29, Township 20 North, Range
10 East, 10 West, County.

The latter well situated upon the same land as the well in Section 29
is on the same location. In your unit covered by the present
terms of the lease, the proposed location of Section 29, and the
14 1/2 feet specified 1200 feet from the north line and 1150 feet
from the west line, is a non-standard well. The location
from any well covered in the Dakota formation could not be ascertained
until 1200 feet in Section 29 has been completed or until a non-
standard well has been approved after hearing.
