ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A (c) Woodrow Stiles made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on December 16, 1960 for permission to dually complete its Ransom Well No. 1, located in the NW/4 SE/4 of Section 13, Township 29 North, Range 11 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from the Aztec-Fruitland Pool and the production of gas from the Aztec-Pictured Cliffs Pool.

NOW, on this 13th day of January, 1961, the Secretary-Director finds:

(1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Subsection 'e' of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;

(2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and

(3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.

(4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.

(5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Woodrow Stiles, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Ransom Well No. 1, located in the NW/4 SE/4 of Section 13, Township 29 North, Range 11 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from the Aztec-Fruitland Pool and the production of gas from the Aztec-Pictured Cliffs Pool, through the casing-tubing annulus and tubing respectively.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section V, Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Aztec-Pictured Cliffs Pool, or as directed by the Secretary-Director of the Commission.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSIONER OF REVENUE SERVICES BE ADVISED OF THE FOREGOING TO KEEPSATION FOR APPROVAL OF THE POSITION OF THE STATE TAX COMMISSIONER AS TO THE TAXES ON THE EXPORT OF SUGAR FROM MEXICO.
