DETAILS OF WORK

This well has been drilled to a total depth of 7,100 feet and was found to be non-productive. It is proposed to plug and abandon the well, setting cement plugs at the following intervals:
10' plug at surface with 4" pipe marker 4' above ground level.
100' of cement from 750' to 850'
100' of cement in top of 9-5/8" pipe stub
100' of cement from 2150' to 2250'
100' of cement in top of 7" pipe stub at 3500'.
175' of cement from 6175 to 6350'
65' of cement from 6800' to 6865'
100' of cement from 7000' to 7100' - Total Depth.
