Ran 4 Jts of 13 3/8" 48# H-40 (110') casing landed at 119' (XB) with 125 sacks of regular cement and circulated to surface. Prior to drilling plug out casing was tested to 500# pressure for 30 min. with no drop; after drilling out cement rotary was stopped and fluid level in casing measured for any drop or use, fluid level remained stationary.
(Well spudded 9/26/51.)

The eighth step is the evaluation of the study, which is done by the investigator. The ninth step is the conclusion, which is done by the investigator. The tenth step is the final report, which is done by the investigator.
