Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your application for approval of a 330.30-acre non-standard gas proration unit in the Blanco-Mesaverde Gas Pool consisting of the following acreage, which non-standard gas proration unit is necessitated by a 1959 Dependent Resurvey.

TOWNSHIP 30 NORTH, RANGE 8 WEST, NMPM
San Juan County, New Mexico, Section 10: E/2

It is understood that this unit is to be dedicated to your Howell Well No. 2, located 1850 feet from the North line and 1825 feet from the East line of said Section 10.

By authority granted me under the provisions of Rule 1 (b), Section 15 of the Special Rules and Regulations for the Blanco-Mesaverde Gas Pool, you are hereby authorized to operate the above described acreage as a non-standard gas proration unit, with allowable to be assigned thereto in accordance with the pool rules, based upon the unit size of 330.30 acres.

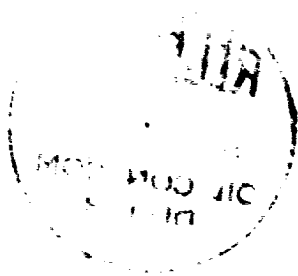

REPORT OF THE COMMISSION ON THE CONSERVATION OF OIL AND GAS RESOURCES IN THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO
SANTA FE, NEW MEXICO, JANUARY 1, 1934

It is the opinion of the Commission that the conservation of oil and gas resources in the State of New Mexico is a matter of great importance, and that the establishment of a conservation fund is a necessary step in the conservation of these resources.

By a resolution adopted by the Commission on January 1, 1934, it was recommended that the Governor of the State of New Mexico should call a special session of the Legislature to consider the establishment of a conservation fund. The Commission believes that the establishment of such a fund is a necessary step in the conservation of the oil and gas resources of the State, and that the Legislature should take prompt action thereon.
