Reference is made to your letter of October 13, 1961.

This well received its first allowable in March, 1961 and has received an allowable based on a deliverability of 5946 MCFD calculated in accordance with Order R-1670, Rule 9(A), page 5.

The allowable has ranged from a low of 19766 MCF for September, 1961 to a high of 67370 in March, 1961. The average allowables in the Basin-Dakota Pool range from a low of 5703 for September, 1961 to a high of 22,344 in March, 1961.

The market demand for each pool is allocated on the basis of 25% acreage plus 75% acreage times deliverability. The enclosed sheet showing a hypothetical case will explain the allocation method.

The commission is cognizant of the fact that per well allowables are down somewhat from previous years but we are at the
