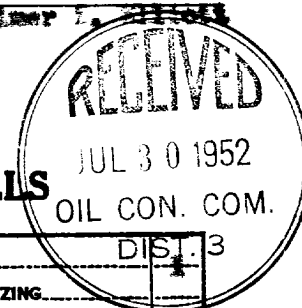

The elevation of the derrick floor above sea level is 5982 ft. (C.L.)

DETAILS OF WORK

Well was spudded at 1:30 P.M., July 18, 1952. On July 19, 1952, 7-5/8" casing was landed at 251 feet and cemented with 215 sacks of cement. Cement circulated to surface. Cement plug down at 7:05 A.M., July 19, 1952. At 7:30 A.M., July 20, 1952, casing and water shut-off were tested at 1050 pounds for 30 minutes with no drop in pressure. Twenty-one feet of solid cement were drilled in bottom of pipe and water shut-off was again tested at 1050 pounds for 30 minutes. There was no drop in pressure during this test and drilling operations were resumed.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
