This is written in order to obtain permission to drill a well en an unerthodex location as stipulated in Rule No. 104 of your rules and regulations booklet.

The main reason for locating the well 990° from the South and 1320° from the East lines as shown on the accompanying plat, is due to the topographical condition of the terrain on the east side where the main irrigation ditch is located.
