Dear Sir:

We have your Notice of Intention to Drill for your #1 Goode well in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ 18-30N-11W. As of this date, your Notice of Intention to Drill has not been approved for the following reasons:

- (1) Your location does not conform to the spacing rules as set out in Rule 104, Section E; and
- (2) There has been no plugging bond approved by the Commission as of this date (See Rule 104, Section A.) If you wish to secure an exception to Rule 104, Section E., it will be necessary for you to write a letter to the Secretary of the Commission in Santa Fe, stating the reason why it is necessary to have an unorthodox location (See Rule 104, Section F.). Also if you wish to begin operations without having a plugging bond approved it will also be necessary for you to secure permission from the Secretary-Director of the Commission.

I have learned from personal inspection that your rig has moved in and started operations on this location. This letter is to inform you that any drilling which you do on this location without approval is at your own risk and that there is a good possibility that the location may have to be moved after you have gone to considerable expense.

Will you please take care of this matter at once?
