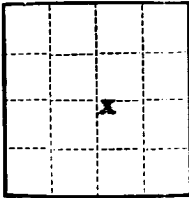

DETAILS OF WORK

10-3/4 in surface pipe, 45#lb, with 75 sacks cement, 87 ft. J.N.L.  
5-1/2 in production casing 14 lb, with 100 sacks cement, 1743 ft. J-55.  
Drilling commenced, APM March-28-1959.  
Drilling completed, April 13, 1959.  
Welex Log, 1800 ft, Perforate 4 shots to ft, by Mercury, 1560 to 1624, 1640 to 1650, 1660 to 1680, 1688 to 1698.  
Fract 1000 barrels oil and 40,000 lb sand.  
Broke down at 2000 lb, back to 1600, then between 1375 to 2000 lb, used 102 balls.  
Injection 48.9 barrels per minute.
