DETAILS OF WORK

(State names of and expected depths to objective sands; show sizes, weights, and lengths of proposed casings; indicate mudlogging jobs, cementing points, and all other important proposed work)

Drilled South Chimney Rock Navajo No. 2 to a total depth of 725'. Ran wireline bailer and found fluid level at 320' with 11' heavy black thick slightly gas cut oil emulsion with 394' salt water titrating 14,500 PPM chlorides.

As a result of not encountering oil or gas production in commercial quantities, this well was plugged and abandoned as follows on October 30, 1959:

1. Spotted 25 sack cement plug 625' - 725' across Gallup sand.
2. Spotted 10 sack cement plug 30' - 60' across base of surface casing.
3. Spotted 3 sack cement plug 0' - 10' in top of surface casing and erected abandonment marker.
4. Used mud laden fluid between plugs.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
