DETAILS OF WORK

Joseph W. Aldrin "A" Well No. 2. On October 23, 1958, perforated Gallup zones with two shots per foot 1500-1510, 1520-1622. Sand-oil frothed with 40,000 gallons oil and 40,000 pounds sand. Formation broke at 1800 pounds, treating pressure 1750 pounds, average injection rate 61 barrels per minute. Injected total 90 perforated ball sealers in two stages 25 each after 19,000 gallons and 23,000 gallons of treatment to obtain selective stimulation. Pressure increased to 2500 pounds, breaking to 1750 pounds with first batch and to 1900 pounds back to 1800 pounds with second batch. Two inch tubing landed at 1657'. Completed as Hermesee Gallup Field Development oil well November 1, 1958. Pumped 95 barrels oil, no water in six hours with 19-40" strokes per minute with 1-1/2" pump. Oil gravity 40.1 degrees API.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.

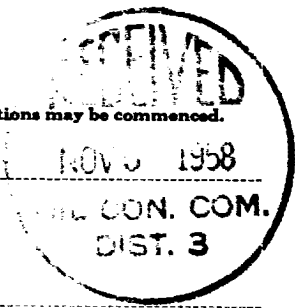

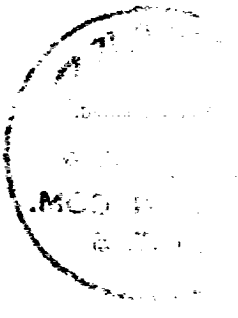
SECURITY OF THE CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE AGENCY
