It is requested that an exception be made for the dry hole marker associated with the recently plugged and abandoned ~~Well No. 1~~. As you are well aware, this marker would pose a liability in the future because of it's location in the school parking lot. Meridian requests that a steel plate be placed at ground level to mark the plugged and abandoned well instead of the traditional dry hole marker. We will also re-survey this location and file the survey with the NMOCD and the Aztec School District for future reference.
