A.P.G. 4950 to 5920' on 7/14/51. Ran 2" tubing, landed at 4988'. Well tested 1930 MCF prior to shot and after clean out tested 4165 MCF. Free is set and well now shut in for 72 hour test.

I understand that this plan of work must give approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.

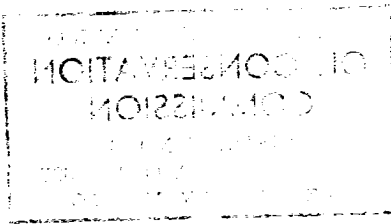
