ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Tenneco Oil Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on July 19, 1965, for permission to dually complete its Florance Well No. 16 located in Unit A of Section 6, Township 30 North, Range 9 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 9th day of August, 1965, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Tenneco Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Florance Well No. 16 located in Unit A of Section 6, Township 30 North, Range 9 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool through the casing-tubing annulus and the tubing respectively.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

that all operators of offset wells have been duly notified, and

(3) That no objections have been received within the
waiting period as prescribed by said rules.

(4) That the proposed lease completion will not cause
unlawful impairment of correlative rights.

(5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion
are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, New Mexico Oil Company, be and
the same is hereby authorized to drill, complete and produce well
No. 10 located in Unit A of Section 8, Township 30 North, Range
3 West, Grant, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to
produce gas from the Blanco-Mesaville Pool and the Basin-Dakota
Pool through the casing-tubing annulus and the tubing respectively.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall comply, operate,
and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Article
113-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take leakage-
leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the
annual deliverability test period for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That completion of this lease
is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the
Commission may deem necessary.
