Dear Mr. Short:

This morning we learned that Mr. Jason Kellahin, your attorney in Santa Fe had contacted the Santa Fe office regarding your #1 Bandy well in Section 3-30N-11W. It seems that Mr. Kellahin was under the impression that the #1 Bandy well was delinquent in regard to 1954 Deliverability Test. He may have gotten this impression from the fact that the Bandy well did produce a short time last fall prior to the time that you re-worked and sand-oil fractured this well. However our records indicate that the actual date of first delivery after final recompletion was November 12, 1954. Order R-333-A specifies that any well connected to a transportation facility after November 1 of any year need not be tested until the next succeeding testing season. Therefore the #1 Bandy well is not delinquent.

If you wish to conduct a Deliverability Test on this well at this time it is all right with the Oil Conservation Commission and your Deliverability as obtained will be used in granting an allowable; however if you would prefer to wait until the 1955 testing season, we will grant your well an allowable based upon 15% of the Initial Potential. We have found that this is the average ratio between Initial Potential and Deliverability.
