

THE APPLICATION OF DELHI-TAYLOR  
OIL CORPORATION FOR A DUAL COMPLETION.

ORDER NO. MC-1351

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Delhi-Taylor Oil Corporation made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on June 17, 1963, for permission to dually complete its Florance Well No. 19 located in Unit H of Section 3, Township 30 North, Range 9 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and Basin-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 8th day of July, 1963, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

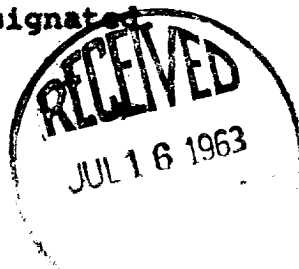
That the applicant herein, Delhi-Taylor Oil Corporation, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Florance Well No. 19 located in Unit H of Section 3, Township 30 North, Range 9 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool through the casing-tubing annulus and the tubing respectively.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Delhi-Taylor Oil Corporation, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Florence Well No. 19 located in Unit H of Section 3, Township 30 North, Range 9 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Messaverde Pool and the Basin-Jakota Pool through the casing-and ng annulus and the tubing respectively.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take backer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Reliability Test period for the Basin-Jakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That production of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
