Gentlemen:

A few weeks ago we wrote you asking about what we believed to be an abandoned location which was filed with this office in October, 1959. This location was staked 990 feet from the South and 330 feet from the West lines of Section 4, Township 30N, Range 17W, and designated the Navajo "A" No. 5. In reply to this we received a copy of a form which we had in our file pertaining to a well which we are carrying as the Navajo "A" #5-X located 2300 feet from the North and 330 feet from the East lines of Section 4-30N-17W, it having been changed from the #5 Navajo "A" located 2310 from North and 330 from East.

Will you please advise whether this old location filed in 1959 is an abandoned location. Also, will you please file a Well Log, Federal Form 9-330, with complete information pertaining to the drilling and completion of the #5-X Navajo "A". The one we have on file received March 19, 1962 apparently contains information only on the 840-foot hole drilled before the location was moved from 2310 from the North and 330 from the East.
