ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A (c) Blackwood and Nichols Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on December 5, 1958, for permission to dually complete its Northeast Blanco Unit Well No. 56-34 located in the NE/4 NE/4 of Section 34, Township 31 North, Range 7 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from the Dakota formation adjacent to the South Los Pinos-Dakota Pool and the production of gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool.

Now on this 6th day of January, 1959, the Secretary-Director finds:

(1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Sub-section 'c' of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;

(2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and

(3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.

(4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.

(5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Blackwood & Nichols Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Northeast Blanco Unit Well No. 56-34 located in the NE/4 NE/4 of Section 34, Township 31 North, Range 7 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from the Dakota formation adjacent to the South Los Pinos-Dakota Pool and the production of gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool, through the tubing and the casing-tubing annulus respectively.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, that applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section V, Rule 112-A, as amended by Order R-1214.

PROVIDED FURTHER, that applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the South Los Pinos-Dakota Pool.

RECOMMENDATION
OF THE COMMISSIONER OF LANDS

Under the provisions of Rule 11-1 (c) Blackwood and Nichols Company
made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on December 7,
1938, for permission to drain the Darton Pool in the NE 1/4 of Section 34,
TOWNSHIP 31 NORTH, RANGE 7 WEST, NEW MEXICO, in such a manner as to permit the
production of gas from the Darton formation adjacent to the South Los Pinos-
Darton Pool and the production of gas from the Darton-Reverse Pool.

Now on this day of January, 1939, the Secretary-Commissioner finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Sub-
section 11-1 (c) of the Commission's Rules and Regulations
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators
of oil wells have been duly notified, and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period
as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed deal completion will not cause waste nor impair
correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed deal completion are feasible
and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Blackwood & Nichols Company, be and the
same is hereby authorized to fully complete the Darton Pool in the
NE 1/4 of Section 34, TOWNSHIP 31 NORTH, RANGE 7 WEST, NEW MEXICO, in such a manner as to permit
the production of gas from the Darton formation adjacent to the South Los Pinos-
Darton Pool and the production of gas from the Darton-Reverse Pool, through
the tubing and the casing-tubing annulus respectively.

PRODUCTION OF GAS FROM THE DARTON POOL, that applicant shall complete, operate, and
produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section 11-1, Rule 11-1, A,
as amended by Order 10-110.

PRODUCTION OF GAS FROM THE DARTON REVERSE POOL, that applicant shall take packer-leakage tests
and completion and pressure treatments during the Initial Deliverability Test
period for the South Los Pinos-Darton Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: that jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may seem necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of correlative rights; upon failure of applicant to comply with any requirement of this order after proper notice and hearing the Commission may terminate the authority hereby granted and require applicant or its successors and assigns to limit its activities to regular single-zone production in the interests of conservation.
