

THE APPLICATION OF BLACKWOOD & NICHOLS COMPANY FOR PERMISSION TO EFFECT DUAL COMPLETION OF ITS NORTHEAST BLANCO UNIT WELL NO. 55-22, LOCATED IN THE NW/4 NE/4 OF SECTION 22, TOWNSHIP 31 NORTH, RANGE 7 WEST, NMPM, SAN JUAN COUNTY, NEW MEXICO, IN SUCH A MANNER AS TO PERMIT THE PRODUCTION OF GAS FROM THE DAKOTA FORMATION ADJACENT TO THE SOUTH LOS PINOS DAKOTA POOL AND THE PRODUCTION OF GAS FROM THE BLANCO MESAVERDE POOL.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A (c) Blackwood & Nichols Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on October 27, 1958, for permission to dually complete its Northeast Blanco Unit Well No. 55-22, located in the NW/4 NE/4 of Section 22, Township 31 North, Range 7 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from the Dakota formation adjacent to the South Los Pinos Dakota Pool and the production of gas from the Blanco Mesaverde Pool.

Now on this 29th day of October, 1958, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Sub-section 'c' of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Blackwood & Nichols Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Northeast Blanco Unit Well No. 55-22, located in the NW/4 NE/4 of Section 22, Township 31 North, Range 7 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from the Dakota formation adjacent to the South Los Pinos Dakota Pool and the production of gas from the Blanco Mesaverde Pool, through the tubing and the casing-tubing annulus respectively.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, that applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section V, Rule 112-A, as amended by Order R-1214.

PROVIDED FURTHER, that applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Blanco Mesaverde Pool.
