Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your application for approval of an unorthodox well location for your San Juan 32-9 Unit, Well No. 64, to be located 425 feet from the South line and 769 feet from the West line and in the SW/4 SW/4 of Section 2, Township 31 North, Range 9 West, Blanco Mesaverde Pool, San Juan County, New Mexico.

It is our understanding that this unorthodox well location is based upon extreme topographic conditions in the SW/4 of said section.

Inasmuch as you are the unit operator of the offset acreage, it is possible for immediate approval to be granted. 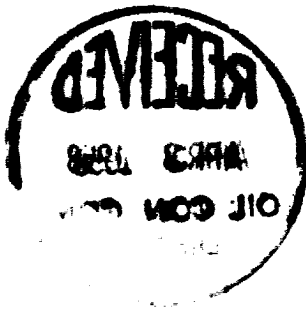
