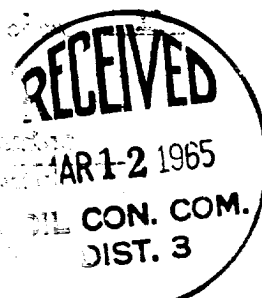

DETAILS OF WORK

Indicate expected depths to water, gas, oil, showings, weight, and lengths of casing, and other data, as well as comments on operations and all other important proposed work.

Well 1-00 B.M., 1-12-64. Drilled 17 1/2" hole to 93 feet. Cemented 13-3/8" casing to 40, 5" casing at 93 feet with 100 sx cement. Circulated estimated cement to surface. W.O.C. 4:00 A.M., 2-13-64. W.O.C. 18 hours. Tested casing to 1000 psi for 30 minutes, O.K. Drilled 12 1/2" hole to 900 feet. Cemented 8-5/8" casing to 891 feet with 350 sx cement. Circulated estimated 36 sx cement to surface. W.O.C. 11:45 P.M., 2-15-64. 18 hours. Tested 8-5/8" casing to 1000 psi for 30 minutes, O.K. Drilled 8-3/4" hole. Encountered water flow at 1300' and 2300'. Mudded up to stop water flow. Reduced hole size from 8-3/4" to 7-7/8" at 4535'. Now drilling below 4535 feet in 7-7/8" hole.

That the plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
