In accordance with New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission procedures, this is to advise you of our Application for Multiple Completion (copy attached) of our Florance Well No. 39A from the Fruitland and Mesa Verde zones. In regard to this application, we should point out that the Fruitland zone was tested but is non-commercial and we have no intention of producing this zone. Because of problems encountered as a result of the dual completion effort, we elected to leave the Fruitland zone shut-in rather than cement squeeze those perforations.
