DETAILS OF WORK

We propose to drill with rotary tools to the top of the Cliffhouse formation and set 7-5/8" casing, then drill with gas to Dakota formation. In the event oil or water is encountered in the Tensile or before the Dakota is reached, hole will be mudded and drilling continued to Dakota. Should the formation below the Mesa Verde prove non-commercial, hole will be plugged back to the base of the Point Lookout and completed as gas well in the entire Mesa Verde section.

250' approx. 13-1/8" casing Circulate cement to surface
4500' approx. 7-5/8" 26.40' casing - 200 sacks of regular cement
7600' approx. 5-1/2" casing (120') - 100 sacks of regular cement
7600' approx. 2" 100' tubing 4.70' - Production string

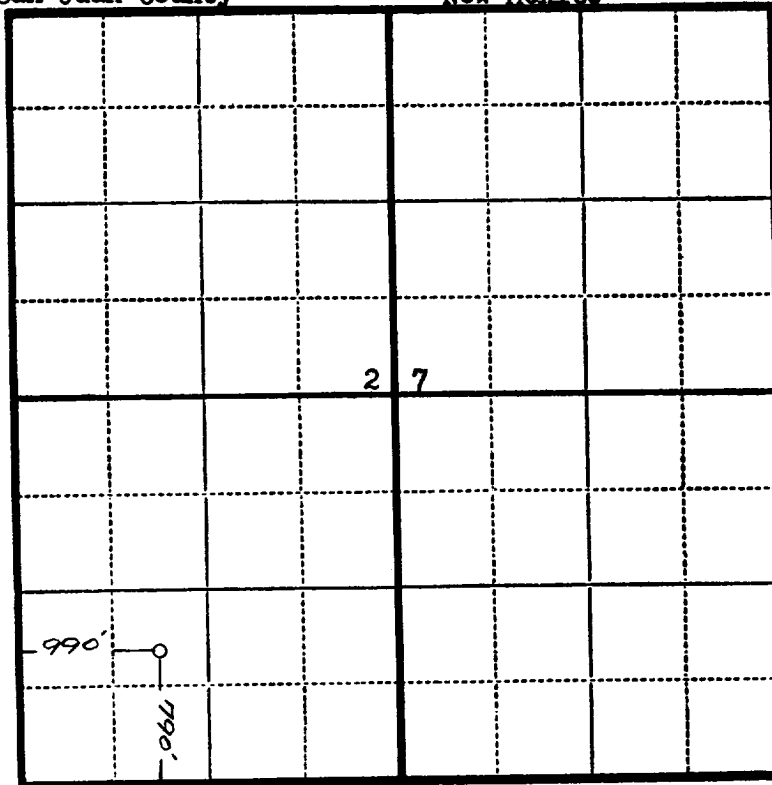
