DETAILS OF WORK

After skidding 50' East of the Ute Mountain Tribal 2-29 No. 2, the Ute Mountain Tribal 2-29 No. 2-X was spudded July 24, 1958. A 15 1/4" hole was drilled to 109', and 8 5/8" casing was cemented at 109' with 110 sacks. Twenty-five sacks were circulated. Casing was tested with 1000 psi for 30-min, after WOC 24 hours. Test was satisfactory. On July 31, 1958, 7 7/8" hole was being drilled at 787'.

Surface Casing: 96' 8 5/8" O. D. 24 lb. J-55 8rd thd New St&C
