I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.

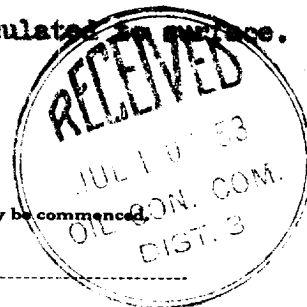
