As discussed with Peggy Bradfield of your company on October 12, 1990, the subject APDs are rescinded and returned due to drilling not being commenced within one year of the approval date and within the second six month extension period.

You are required to request surface rehabilitation instructions from this office if construction activities occurred on the referenced drill site. If this office does not receive comment within 30 days, it will presume that no construction occurred and proceed accordingly. Later discovery that construction activities have in fact occurred, may result in assessment of liquidated damages.
