

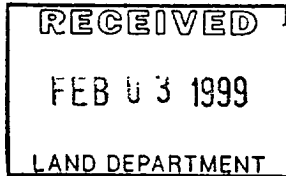




Dear Mr. Catanach:

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM), San Juan Field Office has reviewed all technical data pertaining to the applications from Cross Timbers Oil Company for six unorthodox well locations within the Ute Mountain Ute Reservation, San Juan County, New Mexico. 
