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Gentlemen:

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Your attention is directed to the general letter issued January 24, 1955 by the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission outlining the procedure to be followed for prorating gas in the San Juan Basin. As pointed out in the letter, certain wells in the San Juan Basin could not be classified as standard gas proration units, and these wells were indicated as non-standard units on the March gas proration schedule for the San Juan Basin. Further, the letter points out that all non-standard gas proration units must have either administrative approval or a hearing by May 1, 1955, in order to remain on the gas proration schedule.

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Our records indicate that the following wells operated by you are non-standard units for which we have received no applications requesting approval of said non-standard units.

Blanco-Mesaverde Pool

Vasaly Unit 1-F 31-32-11 Waller Unit 3-1-K 11-32-11

Enclosed you will find a memorandum outlining the filing requirements necessary for approval of non-standard gas proration units. If applications for approval of the above listed non-standard gas proration units are not received by May 1, 1955, these wells will be removed from the schedule and shut-in.

General:

Your attention is directed to the General letter issued January 24, 1928 by the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission outlining the procedure to be followed for protection gas in the San Juan Basin. As pointed out in the letter, certain wells in the San Juan Basin could not be classified as non-flammable due to the proportion of gas production water, and these wells indicated a tendency to catch fire. Further, the letter points out that all non-flammable gas should be protected from water until such time as protection equipment becomes available.

Our records indicate that the following wells operating by you are non-flammable due to which we have received no application regarding protection of these wells.

Bilbao-Messaline Pool

11-35-11 11-35-11 31-35-11 1-1 1-1 Aqueous Unit

We hope you will find a momentary outline of the filing procedure. It is necessary to have a copy of the protection rules to file a complaint for protection of the pool.
