 Core No. 1985 to 5738 - recovered 53'. 20' dark gray lime - NS; 6' light gray lime -
 bleeding oil, good porosity; 6' gray lime, shale streaks; 4' dark gray lime, pinpoint
 porosity, slightly bleeding oil; 17' dark gray lime, shale on lower part.
 Core No. 2558 to 5783 - recovered 25'. 3.5' light gray limestone with good intercrystalline
 lime and auger porosity, some yellow oil stain, slightly bleeding oil; 2' dark gray
 6.5' light gray limestone, looks dense, numerous slightly irregular pores, limestone,
 good intercrystalline and auger porosity, looks wet.
 Core No. 5783 to 5802 - recovered 19'. 7' light gray cherty limestone, no
 apparent porosity; 7' light gray limestone, fair to good intercrystalline pores,
 porosity; 8' gray limestone with scattered thin shale zones, no apparent porosity.
 Core No. 5828 to 5867 - recovered 39'. 8' black shale w/6" coal beds, oil bearing limestone
 looks light; 7' light gray limestone w/very pinpoint porosity, slightly bleeding oil &
 salt water; 5' gray dense limestone w/very slight irregular pores, 19' black
 limestone w/numerous black shale zones, becomes more shaly toward bottom.
 Core No. 5867 to 5917 - recovered 49'. 3' dark gray, finely crystalline shaly
 limestone, looks light; 42' gray finely crystalline light limestone w/small amount of
 dark oil staining along fractures; 4' black, very calcareous shale w/streaks of shaly
 limestone, looks light.
