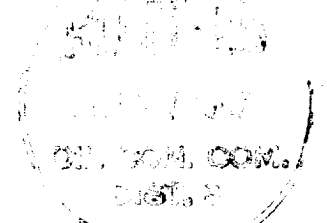


THE APPLICATION OF AZTEC OIL & GAS  
COMPANY FOR A DUAL COMPLETION.

ORDER NO. MC-1794

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION



Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Aztec Oil & Gas Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on September 26, 1967, for permission to dually complete its Decker Well No. 2 located in Unit A of Section 26, Township 32 North, Range 12 West, NMFM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool.

NOW, on this 16th day of October, 1967, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Aztec Oil & Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Decker Well No. 2 located in Unit A of Section 26, Township 32 North, Range 12 West, NMFM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool through the casing-tubing annulus and the tubing, respectively.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-1, Art. 112-1, of the Oil & Gas Company's  
application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on September  
18, 1967, for permission to drill and complete its Decker Well No. 1  
located in Unit A of Section 26, Township 32 North, Range 12 West,  
NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas  
from the Blanco-Mesa Verde Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 15th day of October, 1967, the Secretary-Director  
finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of

- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all  
operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting

PROVIDED HOWEVER, that applicant shall complete, operate, and  
produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-1.

PROVIDED FURTHER, that applicant shall take packer-leakage tests  
upon completion and annually thereafter during the annual deliverability  
test period for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That jurisdiction of this case is hereby retained for the entry  
of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
