
### DESCRIPTION OF THE TOPOGRAPHICAL CONDITIONS FOR THE HORSESHOE #7 WELL

The proposed well location for the Horseshoe #7 Well is at the base of a mesa which rises approximately 400 feet immediately in elevation from the surface location of this well in the SE/4 SW/4 of Section 30, Township 32 North, Range 17 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico. The dedicated acreage for this well, which is projected as a Horseshoe Gallup well, is 40 acres.

Access to the proposed location will be made by an existing road, and then constructing a new access road of approximately 150 feet in length to the well site.

If the well was situated in an orthodox location under Rule 104(C)(I) of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division's Rules and Regulations, it would be located on the above mentioned mesa. Access to an orthodox location on top of the bluff would require extensive road building with attendant disruption of terrain. Additionally, an orthodox location in this quarter quarter section would be north of the proposed location, and would not be as geologically favorable.

A topographical plat is attached hereto to more adequately add to the description of the location of this well.
