Dear Mr. Woosley:

Reference is made to your well No. 17 Navajo located in NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of sec. 28, T. 32 N., R. 17 W., San Juan County, New Mexico, lease 14-20-603-5012. Your Completion Report received January 11, 1983, indicates the well has been completed for 252 MCFPG and has been shut-in without tubing installed while waiting on a pipeline connection. You are hereby advised that this well may not be retained as a shut-in gas well in this fashion for longer than 90 days from the date of this letter. In order to be classified as a shut-in gas well, the well must be equipped in such a manner as to be producible.

Unless you obtain a waiver from the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division to their rule R-107 d(2) you are hereby required to install tubing or condition the well for temporarily abandonment. If you choose to temporarily abandon the well, please contact this office for our requirements.

Failure to timely meet this request will result in the assessment of liquidated damages or penalties, as appropriate.

You are further advised that this decision is appealable pursuant to 30 CFR 221.
