We intend to test shut-off on 70 feet of 10" surface pipe by drying up the hole and testing pipe for any leaks. Pipe is 40 lbs. to the foot in weight and was run to the total depth of 70 feet and cemented with 60 sacks of cement by Halliburton. The casing is set in Dakota Sand.
