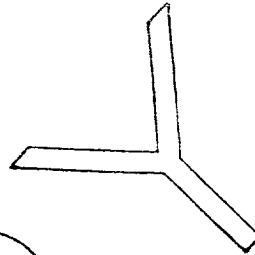

Dear Mr. Spurrier:

Enclosed you will find Notice of Intention to Drill a well to the Pictured Cliffs sand, 1040' from the North line and 840' from the West line of Section 2, Township 26 North, Range 6 West, in Rio Arriba County, made out by Doswell and Pettigrew. Also enclosed is a letter explaining why they made this unorthodox location.

Owing to the roughness of the terrain, I hereby recommend that they be allowed to drill the well on the described location. However, I am mailing the forms for your approval. If they are allowed the 200' tolerance in this field the same as the Blanco field, then their location is still O.K.

Please notify this office and Mr. Doswell as soon as possible what decision you have made.
