DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

Treated this well with 1000 gallons acid pumped into pay formation from 4090' to 4185' with 600 pounds pressure. Chased acid with 45 barrels of oil and then shut well in. Left well shut in for 48 hours and then commenced producing normally thru 28/64" choke for ten days, as required by the Proration office, and tested well for new potential. Received new potential of 10,368 barrels per day and, effective March 16th, 1934, daily allowance was increased to 216 barrels.
